*"Action on behalf of justice and participation in the
transformation of the world fully appear to us as a
constitutive dimension of the preaching of the Gospel or,
in other words, of the Church's mission for the redemption of
the human race and its liberation
from every oppressive situation."*

1971: Synod of Bishops' Statement "Justice in the World"

*Black American History has in large part been a continuous
proclamation of the Gospel of Jesus Christ as stated by Catholic
Bishops in 1971, long before the bishops made the statement.
Black American History has been 'action' taken for the
transformation of America by disciples of Jesus for the
liberation of people "from oppressive [situations]."*

*As we celebrate this aspect of American History, some of us
may find inspiration, hope and ways to be in action in this
present moment of darkness. From Harriet Tubman, Frances
Ellen Watkins Harper (1825-1911), the Still family to Octavius

Haitai, to the States have been in action for the redemption of
the human race. On the walls of Assumption church are

a shining light for those people walking in valley of the shadows

Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Zephaniah 2:3, 3:12-13

Zephaniah prophesies that the Lord will punish wicked nations along with Jerusalem, but he will shelter from his anger those who practice justice and humility and do no wrong.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 1:26-31

Paul tells the Corinthians that God prefers the humble, the weak, the lowly of station — people like themselves. In Christ Jesus they will find wisdom, honor and justice.

Gospel: Matthew 5:1-12a

Jesus teaches the Beatitudes in his Sermon on the Mount. He extols those who are merciful, peaceful, lowly, poor in spirit and promises them that "the reign of God is theirs."

"Seek the Lord, all you humble of the earth, who have observed his law, seek justice and humility, perhaps you may be sheltered on the day of the Lord's anger. For I will leave as a remnant in your midst a people humble and lowly who shall take refuge in the name of the Lord... Blessed are they..."

How frequently do we hear the word 'seek' in the scriptures. 'Seek first the kingdom of God'... 'Seek and you will find'... Our Christian lives are calls, summons to action, not moments to sit back and do nothing. For this reason, the beatitudes of Matthew today describe what action is required of us - to be poor in spirit or dependent upon God, humble, pursuing justice and holiness, be merciful, prayerful and peacemakers. Now is the time to get up and get going.

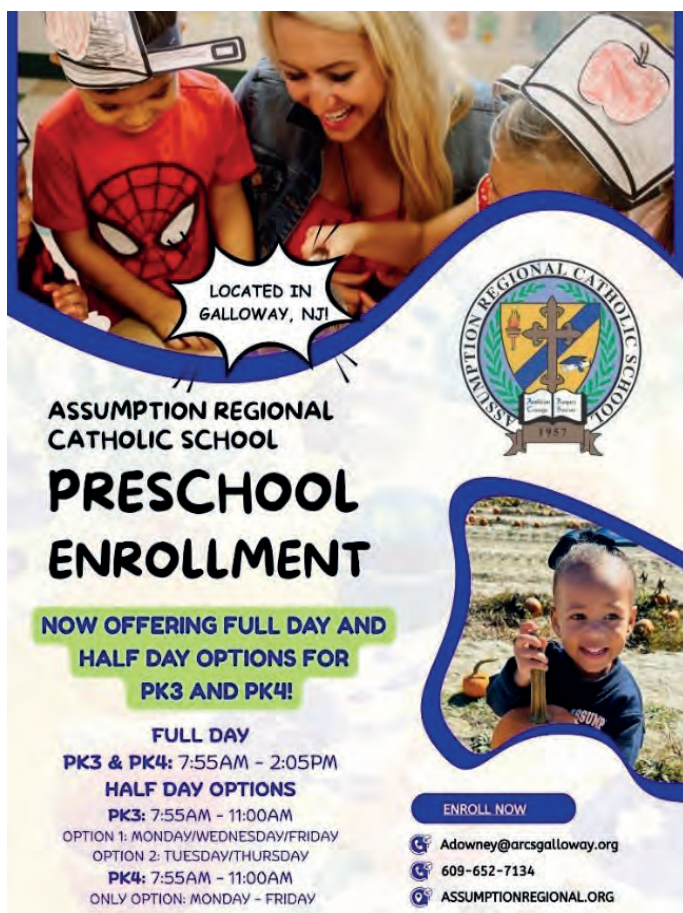

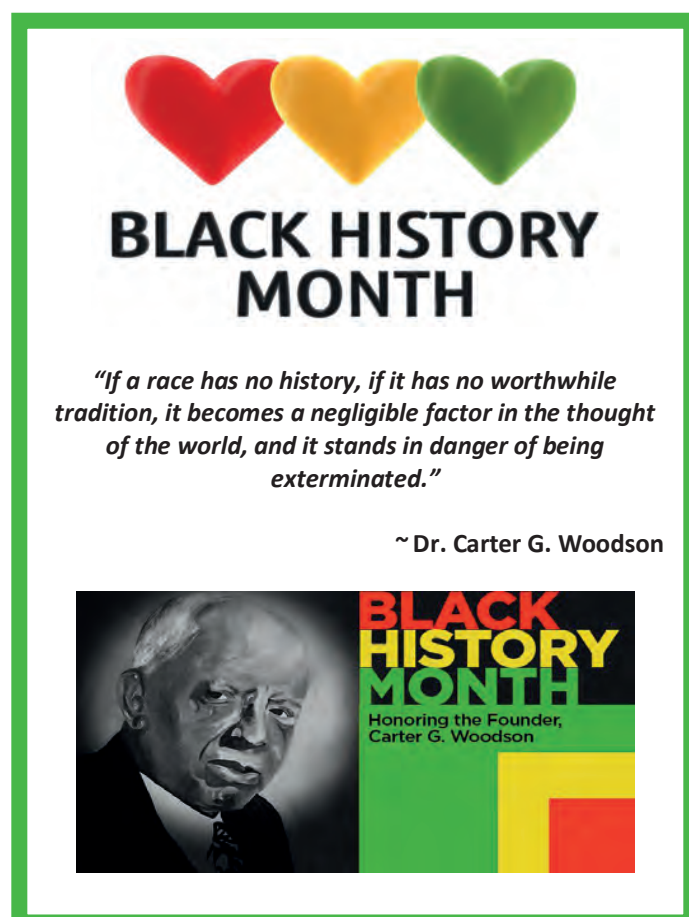

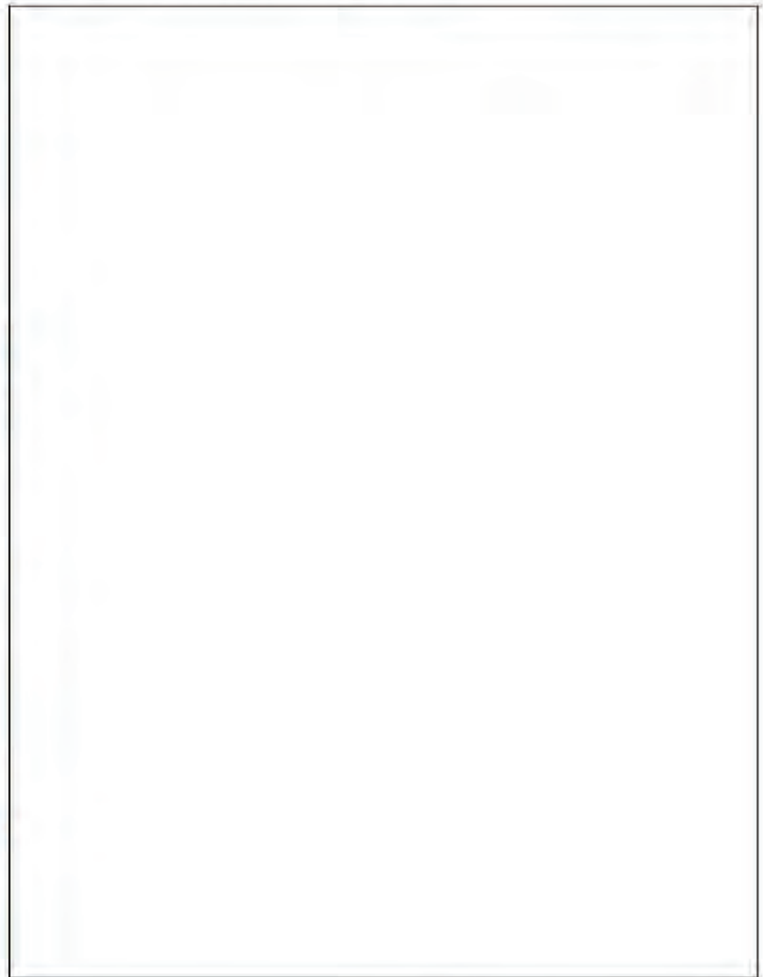

1971: Declaración del Sínodo de Obispos "Justicia en el Mundo"

La historia afroamericana ha sido en gran parte una proclamación continua del Evangelio de Jesucristo tal y como lo afirmaron los obispos católicos en 1971, mucho antes de que los obispos hicieran esa declaración. La historia afroamericana ha sido una 'acción' tomada para la transformación de América por discípulos de Jesús para la liberación de las personas "de situaciones opresivas".

Jesús enseña las Bienaventuranzas en su Sermón del Monte. Exalta a quienes son misericordiosos, pacíficos, humildes y pobres de espíritu y les promete que "el reinado de Dios es suyo."

"Buscad al Señor, todos vosotros, humildes de la tierra, que habéis observado su ley, buscad justicia y humildad, quizá podáis ser protegidos en el día de la ira del Señor. Porque dejaré como remanente entre vosotros un pueblo humilde y humilde que se refugiará en el nombre del Señor... Benditos sean..."

¿Con qué frecuencia escuchamos la palabra 'buscar' en las escrituras? 'Busca primero el reino de Dios'... 'Busca y encontrarás'... Nuestras vidas cristianas son llamados, llamados a la acción, no momentos para sentarse y no hacer nada. Por esta razón, las bienaventuranzas de Mateo hoy describen qué acción se requiere de nosotros: ser pobres de espíritu o depender de Dios, humildes, buscar la justicia y la santidad, ser misericordiosos, orantes y pacificadores. Ahora es el momento de levantarse y ponerse en marcha.

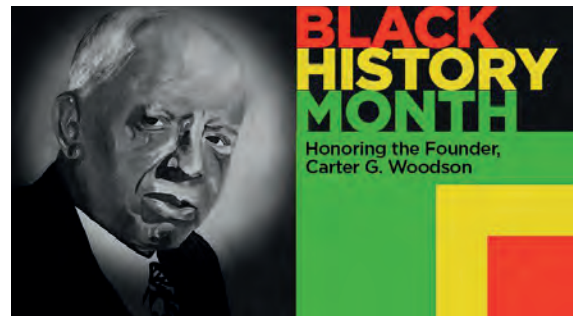
